Women's History Month

The event traces its beginnings to the first International Women's Day in 1911.

In <u>1978</u>, the <u>school district</u> of <u>Sonoma, California</u>, participated in <u>Women's History Week</u>, an event designed around the week of March 8 (International Women's Day).

In <u>1981</u>, responding to the growing popularity of the event, Congress passed a resolution making Women's History Week a national holiday. This week was well received, and soon after, schools across the country began to have their own local celebrations. The next year, leaders from the California group shared their project at the Women's History Institute at <u>Sarah Lawrence College</u>. Other participants not only became determined to begin their own local Women's History Week projects but also agreed to support an effort to have Congress declare a national Women's History Week.

Also in 1981, Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-Utah) and Rep. Barbara Mikulski (D-Maryland) cosponsored the first Joint Congressional Resolution proclaiming a "Women's History Week." Soon, other state departments of education began to encourage celebrations of National Women's History Week as a way to promote equality among the sexes in the classroom.

Maryland, Pennsylvania, Alaska, New York, Oregon and other states developed and distributed curriculum materials in all of their public schools, which prompted such events such as essay contests. Within a few years, thousands of schools and communities got on the bandwagon that was National Women's History Week, with the support and encouragement from governors, city councils, school boards, and the U.S. Congress. Congress legally expanded the focus to a whole month in 1987. Since then, the National Women's History Month Resolution has been approved with bipartisan support in both the House and Senate

range of complaints relating to pests in your homes and the way residents dispose of their trash.

The Maintenance Staff is not allowed to offer you pesticides. They are required to contract with a professional extermination company.

The Extermination Company "Scientific" is generally scheduled on Thursdays, call before Thursday to be serviced. We ask you to please continue to work with us by combating pest in your home, too. The following list relates to several different baits you may purchase in your local Grocer or Hardware stores.
