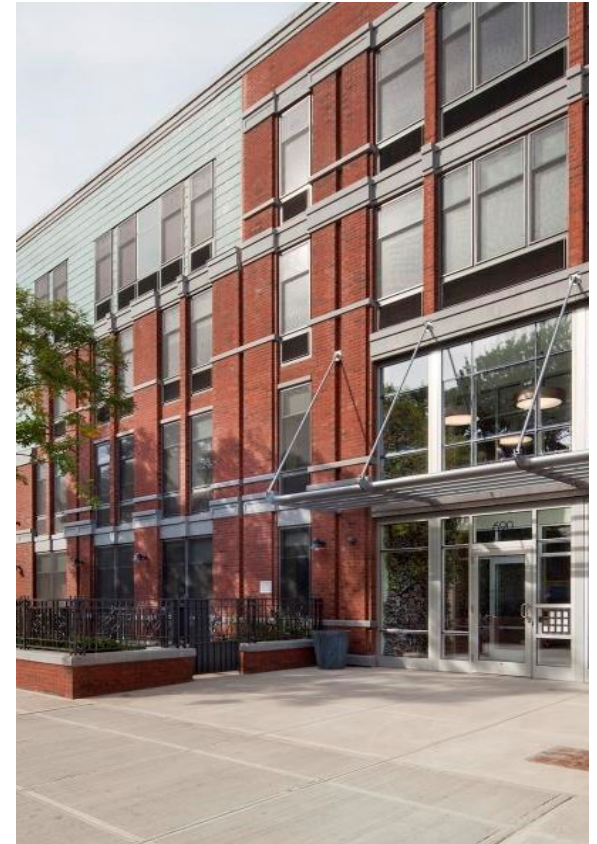

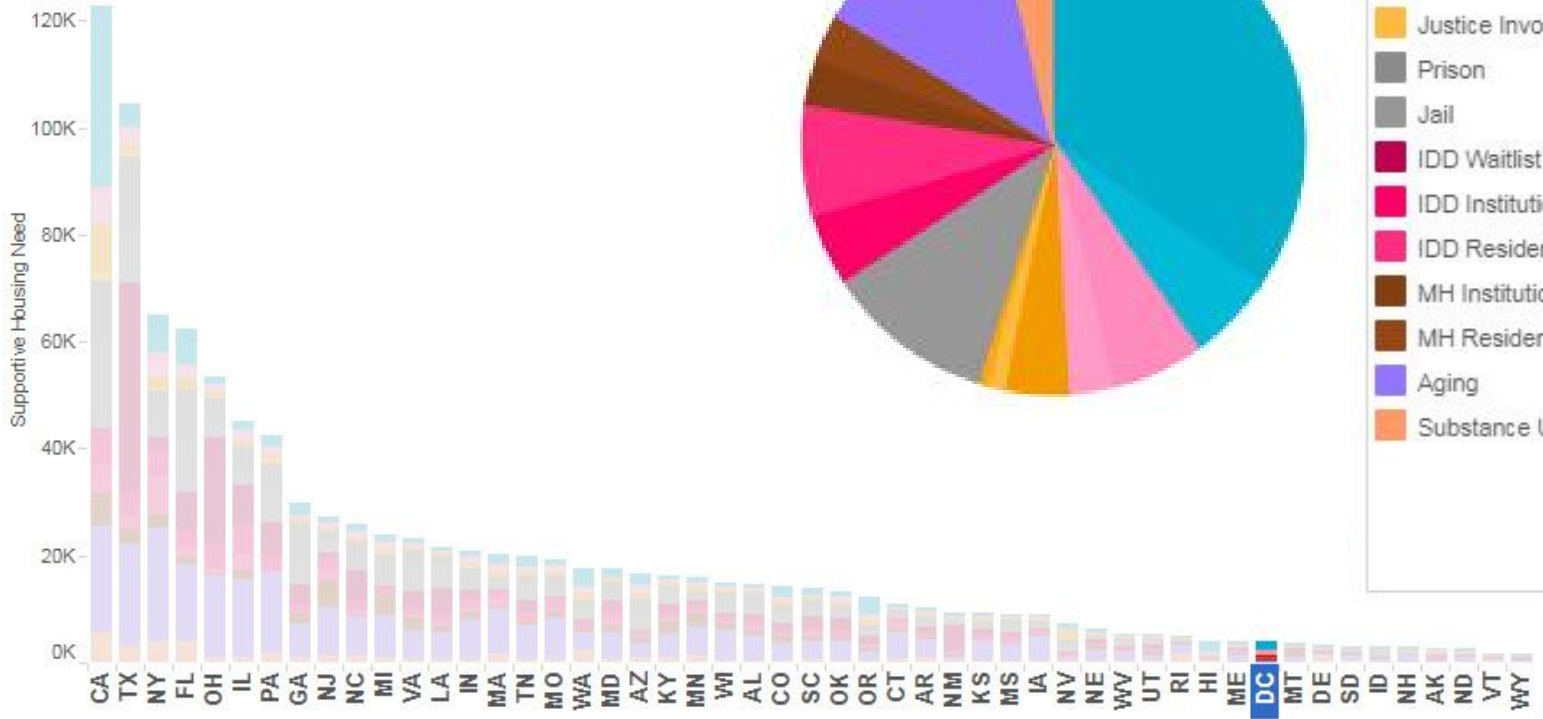
Supportive housing combines affordable housing with services that help people who face the most complex challenges to live with stability, autonomy and dignity.

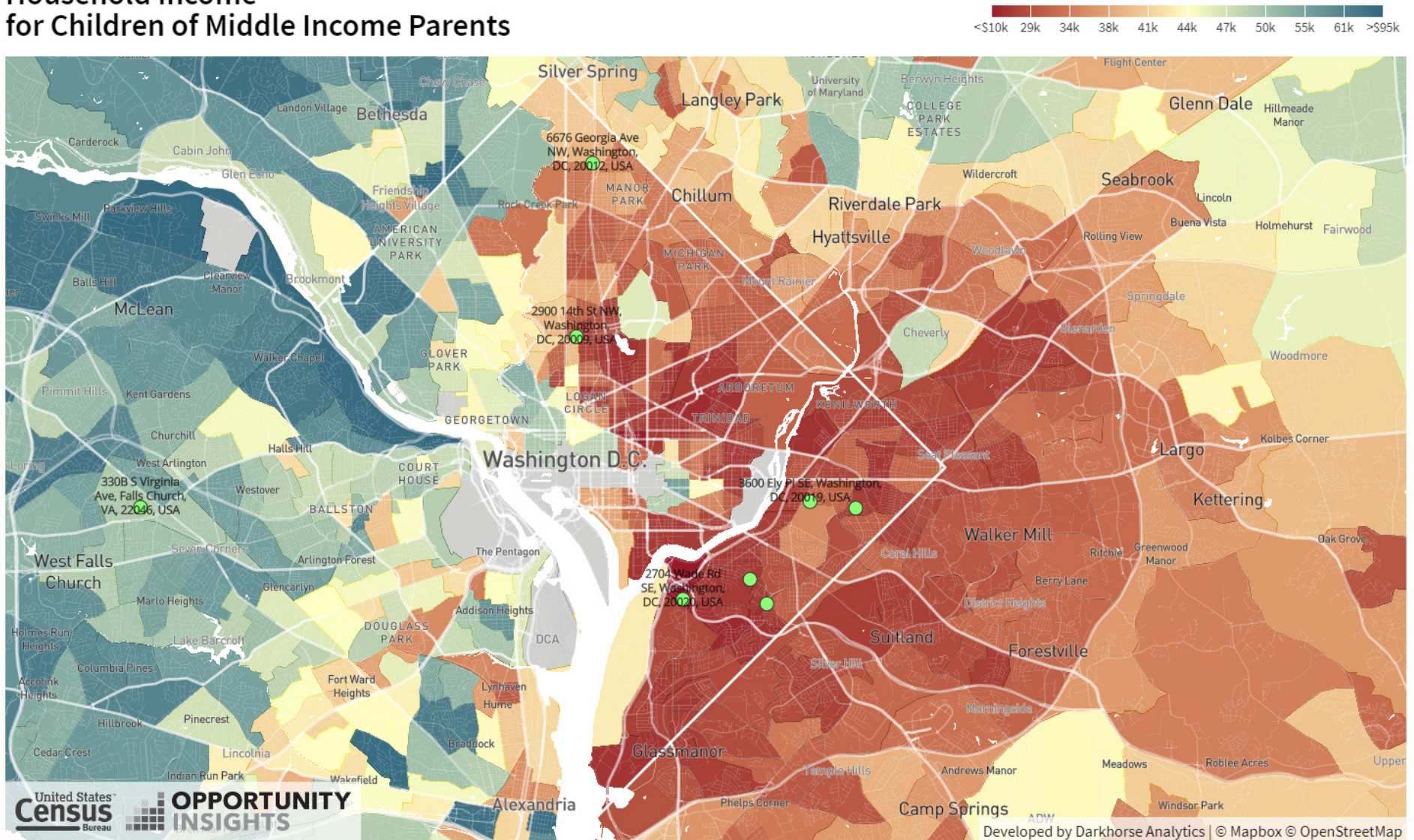

Household Income for Children of Middle Income Parents

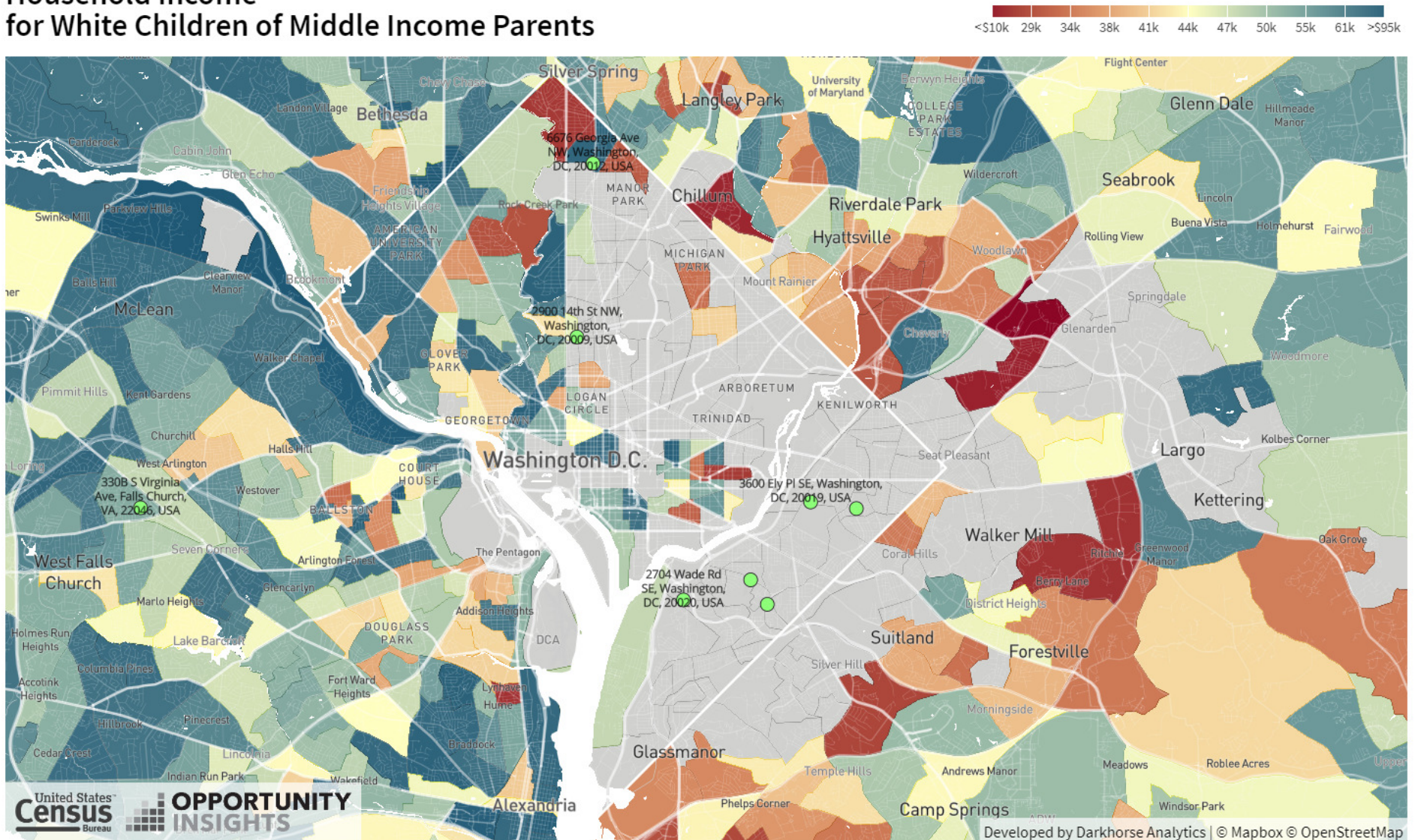

Household Income for White Children of Middle Income Parents

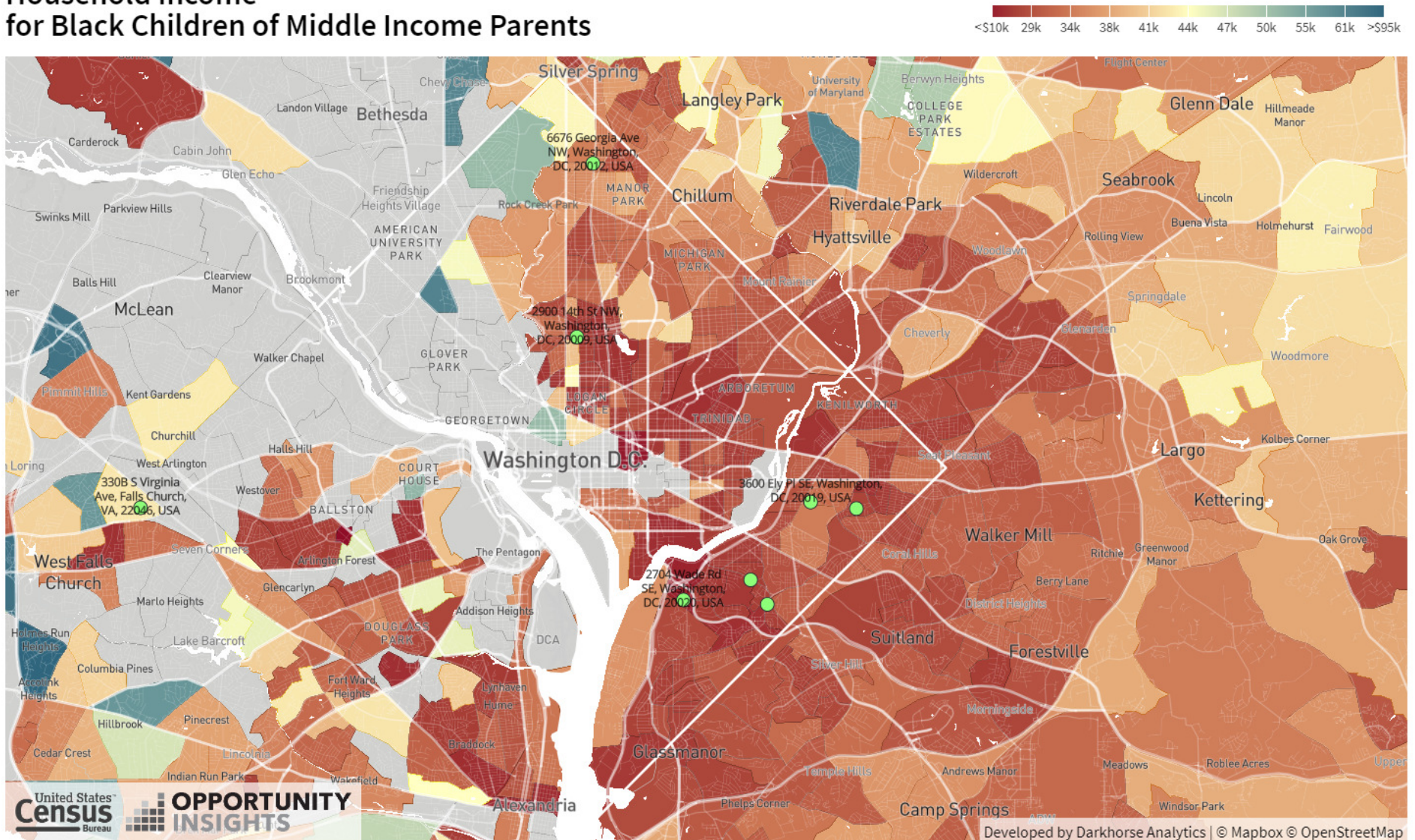

Household Income for Black Children of Middle Income Parents

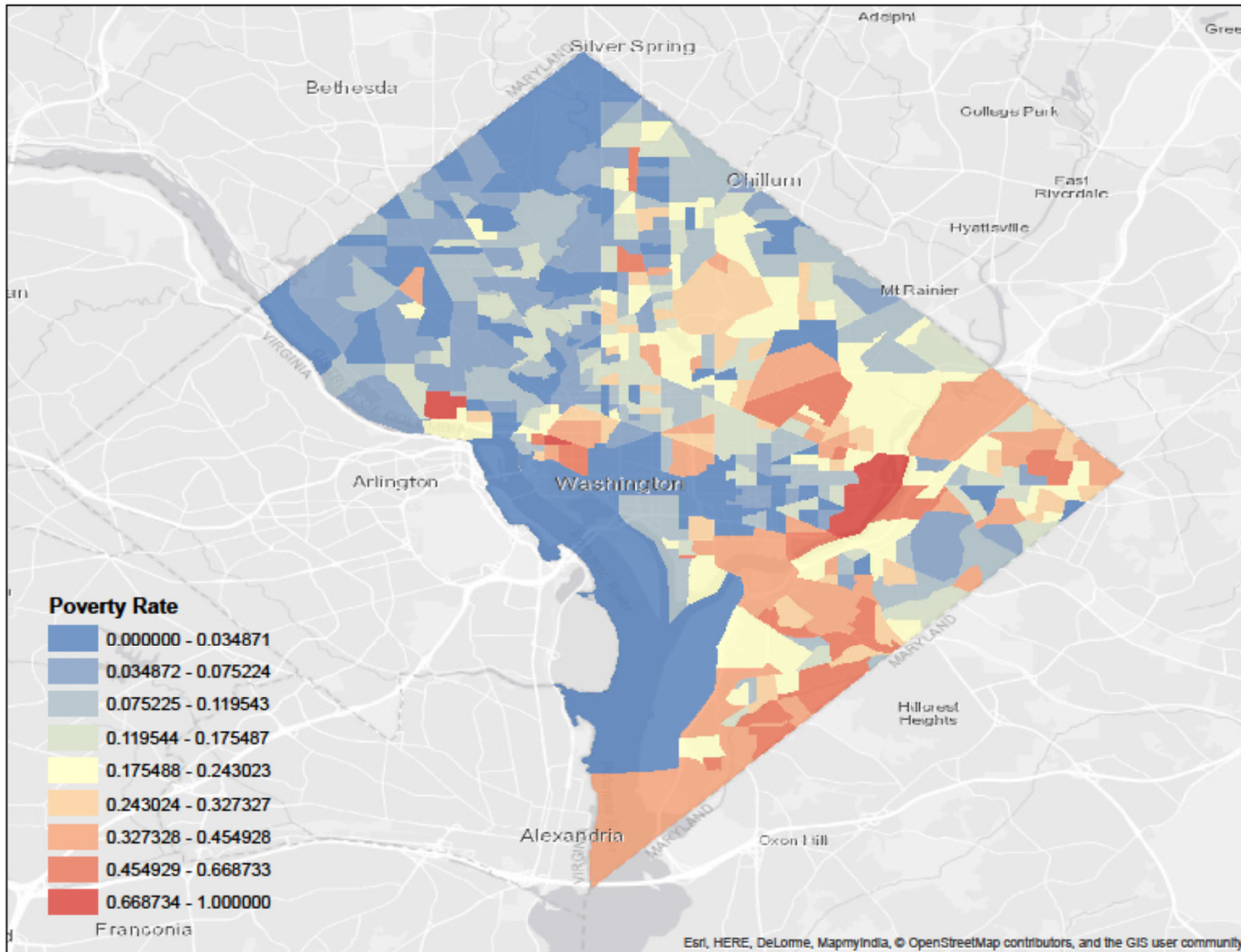

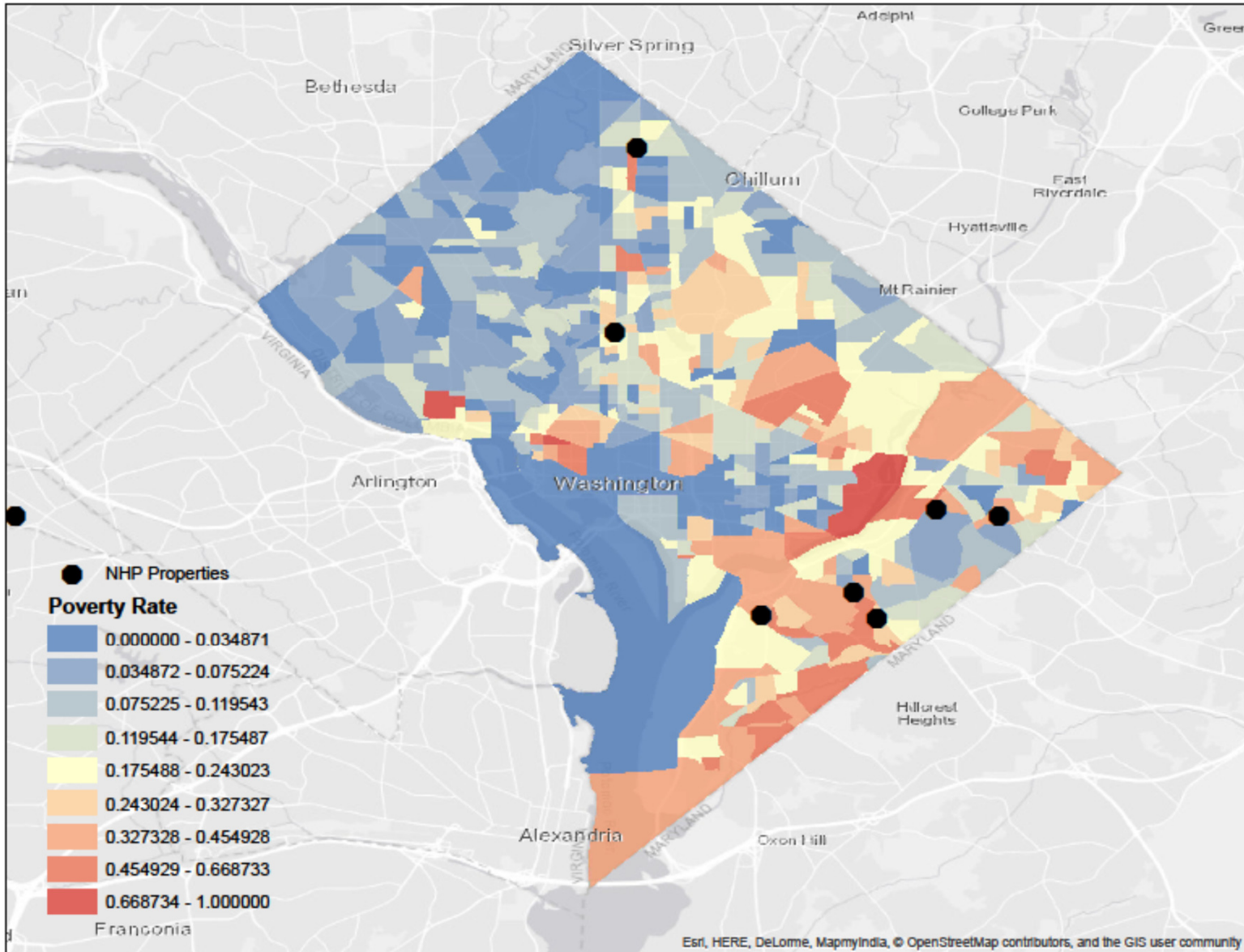

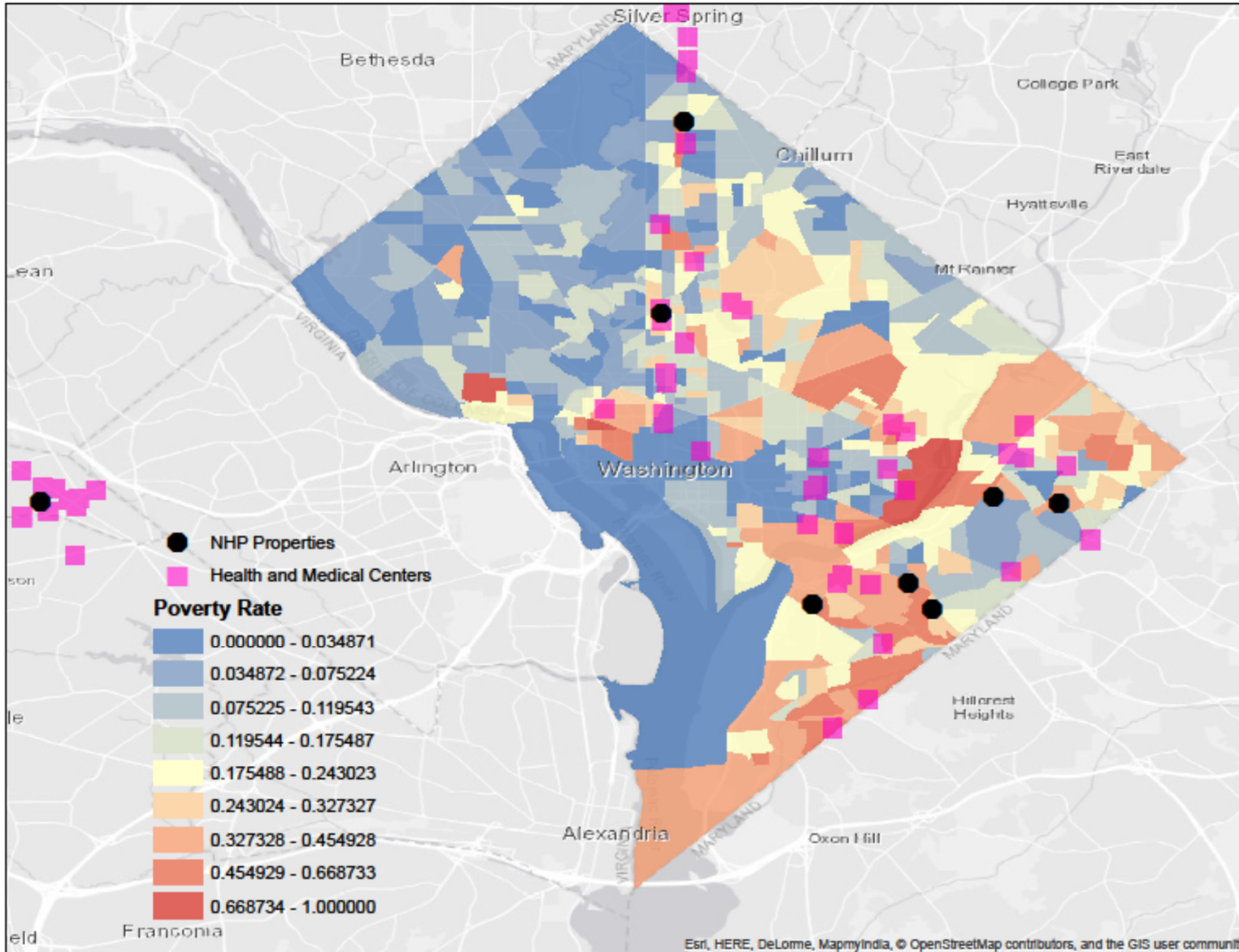

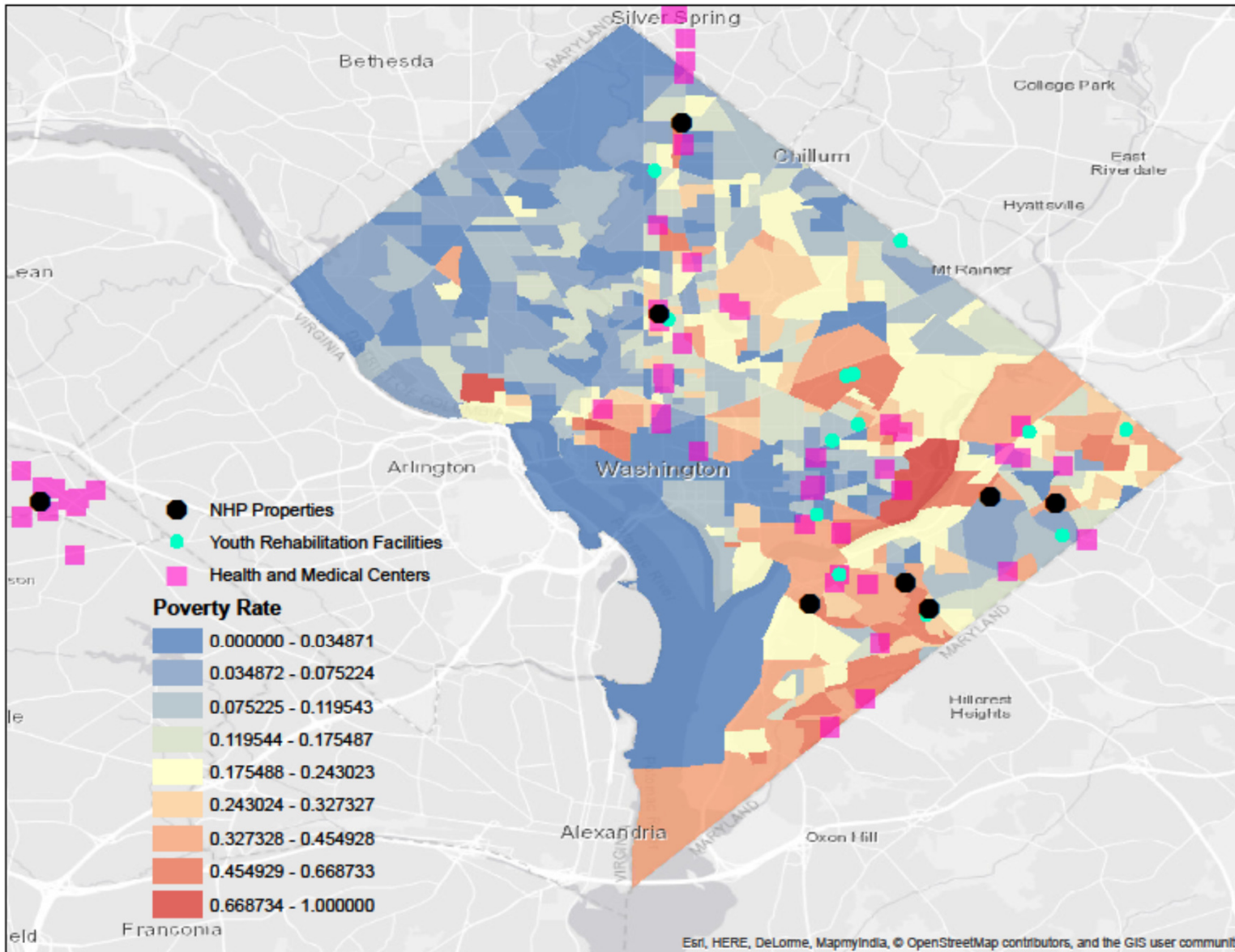

Redefining Who Supportive Housing Is For



Health/BH/EMT Data

44% of jail inmates have MH disorder; 24% have multiple chronic conditions

HMIS Data

Rates of homelessness among people exiting correctional institutions are 10-25%

Jail Data

A national needs assessment performed by CSH found that nationally more than 139,000 people in custody on a given day need supportive housing.
